SERVICE AND SECURITY TO OUR COMMUNITY

POLICY ON CRIME:

High Plains works in conjunction with the local law enforcement agencies to provide a safe and secure environment for students, employees, and community members. It is the policy of this institution to gather information regarding a crime and secure the appropriate assistance of law enforcement agencies and/or site authorities.

REPORTING ON CRIME:

Crime victims, regardless of the seeming insignificance of the crime are encouraged to preserve all of the evidence, and to report the incident to the Administration Office in person or by phone. An official report will be taken and copies will be made available to the victim. Efforts to investigate the situation will be made at the appropriate agency level.

- When parking, remove valuables from plain view.
- Avoid getting into no-exit places.
- At night, always walk in groups of two or more.
- Report all incidents immediately.
